"He is Risen indeed!"

He has Risen indeed! Let us look at life in the season of Birth and Rebirth! Our Lord's death and resurrection were the turning points in the history of creation. It made all things new. The resurrection is a pledge that one day, every tomb, like the tomb of Christ, will be empty. That life will not end with death. Easter is not a one-man show. Jesus is alive. 
